BROUGHANLEA CROSS

A short distance away from Culfeightrin Church on the A2 Ballycastle-Cushendall Rd. opposite Colliers' Hall stands a small crude cross about 1m high, on a ditch by the roadside. It has two carvings: in the centre is a well-defined crosier, just to the right and slightly lower, is a T-shaped carving which has been interpreted as a *Tau* cross. It is believed that the stone came originally from the ancient Church and graveyard at Magherintemple (Old Culfeightrin) and was moved to its present site in 1790.
